

Basic Search Practice

If you practice using keywords and conducting searches, you will understand it better and also be able to find what you are looking for quickly and easily.

Below is a list of practice searches to do so you can get used to using keywords and finding the correct information quickly. Remember- there are different ways to find this information, and many of them are correct. Keep trying until you find what you are looking for!

Access Google like you learned in the course- by typing www.google.com in the address bar. Then you can type your keywords in the search box.

1. Your friend told you that City Colleges of Chicago offers tuition-free GED prep classes. Find more information about that.
2. You are taking your nephews to Millennium Park this weekend and you need to find a restaurant that you can walk to for lunch. Where will you go to eat?
3. You have a new neighbor from Moldova, which is a country that you do not know anything about. You want to see it on a map so you can learn where your neighbor comes from. Find a map. Where is Moldova?
4. Find the address of the closest Best Buy store.
5. Your nephews loved going downtown to see Millennium Park, so you are thinking about taking them to the Field Museum next month. What time does the Field Museum close on Saturdays?
6. What year did Ozzie Guillen start playing for the Chicago White Sox? What team did he play for after he left the Sox?
7. Can you find a list of all of the Unemployment Offices within 15 miles of the zip code 60616?
8. Is the National Veterans Art Museum in Milwaukee?
9. These Chicago Public Library branches are named after people: Bezazian, Manning, and Walker. Can you find the full names of the people these branches were named after? Can you learn anything about them?
10. You might take a vacation to Nashville, Tennessee this summer. How long will it take to drive there from Chicago? What is the average temperature in Nashville in July?
